

# Analysis Sheet for Practice Grammar Test

After you have taken the *Practice English Language Skills Test* and have calculated your score with the help of the *Answer Key*, use this *Analysis Sheet* to help you figure out which skills you need to work on to improve your score. (If you are taking ENC 1101, you should be aiming for a score of at least 70%; if you are taking ENC 1102, you should be aiming for a score above 80%).

To determine which skills you need to practice, look down the left-hand column, marked *Test Item Numbers*, and identify the item numbers of the test questions you got wrong. For example, let's say you got numbers, 1, 11, 17, and 29, and 31 wrong on the Practice Test; in this case, the column marked *Skills* tells you that you have problems with Spelling, Verb Forms, and Denotation/Connotation.
